

# Burnie Shines exhibition to showcase Lazenby's digital flair

SISTERS Beach digital artist Cain Lazenby is excited about being this year's Burnie Shines feature artist.

"It's really great timing," he said.

"I've been developing my own style for a couple of years now, and I had some works lined up and ready to go."

Mr Lazenby's exhibition will be opened tonight by Honey Bacon, wife of the late former premier Jim Bacon, at Creative Paper Tasmania.

Mr Lazenby, 31, is a graphic designer and web designer with his own business, Niche Graphics. His digital artwork has been described as a "cross between Tubular Bells, Salvador Dali and M. C. Escher".

Mr Lazenby was commissioned by the Burnie City Council to provide the promotional artwork for this year's Burnie Shines festival.

Mr Lazenby's exhibition at Creative Paper will feature 10 limited edition digital artworks.

He is collaborating with his friend, sculptor Scott Bernard, for the exhibition.
